Recent headlines have been dominated by massive attacks by hackers and other data breaches resulting in improper disclosure of significant amount of sensitive consumer information, governmental scrutiny and crippling fines and penalties. 




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3 perspectives are added featuring the main trends that shape the future of medicine such as which stage of the delivery of healthcare and the practice of medicine is affected (prevent & prepare; data input & diagnostics; therapy & follow-up; and outcomes & consequences), whether it affects patients or healthcare professionals; and the practicability of it (already available – green; in progress – orange; and still needs time – red).



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
